Now volunteers are ever present on site and the work is incredible! Walls are framed, plywood is installed and four partner families will soon realize their dreams of owning a home.


Ultimately, our Third Street Redevelopment Project will include 9 new homes. We plan to work with existing homeowners on Third Street to revitalize the Fourth Ward in Englewood. We hope that while we build houses, our Habitat homeowners will build a community that takes pride in its neighborhood.

We have received an outpouring of support from corporations such as Disney/ABC and the Federal Home Loan Bank of New York, as well as many local houses of worship. Habitat Bergen and AHOME Partner Up to Provide Affordable Housing

With our non-profit partner, AHOME (Affordable Housing of Metropolitan Edgewater), Habitat Bergen will refurbish 18 apartments on Undercliff Avenue in Edgewater during the next year. Each apartment will be sold to qualified homeowners at prices that meet affordability quidelines.

Habitat volunteers began the demolition and construction process on the first unit this past April. As each apartment becomes vacant, volunteers will remodel it. We hope that some of the current tenants will opt to become homeowners, as well.

"This kind of revitalization is desperately needed in Edgewater, because of

the land constraints there," said Susan Safire, Executive Director of Habitat Bergen. "Edgewater is only 0.85 square miles, so instead of building new, we can refurbish the old and provide affordable housing for Edgewater residents."

As President of AHOME, Lois Fein worked diligently to get funding and approval for this project. Her efforts were recognized in June, when she received Habitat Bergen's Builder of the Year Award at our annual dinner.

Habitat's partnership provides the volunteer labor necessary to make this project a success. The Greyheads and Youth United volunteers have worked

non-stop throughout the summer. It's amazing what happens when people come together with a common goal in mind!

Youth United Takes Charge!

We currently have over 250 members who work diligently to raise awareness and funds in the spirit of eliminating poverty housing in Bergen County.
