Habitat Bergen is seeking volunteers to join our Family Support Committee, and we need your help! With the construction of our Bergenfield home currently underway, our partner family and future homeowners, Carlos and Geovana Pimentel, will soon begin working with the Family Support Committee to prepare for first-time homeownership!



What is the Family Support Committee?

A volunteer-driven committee that serves to prepare and guide our partner families throughout the process of first-time homeownership, and provide ongoing support to homeowners after they move in.

What do committee members do?

- Prepare for closing on the home with the Construction Team
- Work directly with the Pimentel family to ensure they successfully complete their 400 hours of sweat equity in time for the closing date
- Develop and implement a Homeowner Readiness program, which includes recruiting and training a partner family mentor(s) and building a homeownership education program with classes such as:
 - Budgeting and financial management
 - Homeowner maintenance and safety
 - Closing process and legal matters
- Plan the Home Dedication Ceremony with Habitat Bergen's staff, when the Pimentel family will be presented with the keys to their home

The Committee meets monthly, at Habitat Bergen's office in River Edge, during a weekday evening. If you are a Bergen County resident, this is a great way to **get involved** with Habitat Bergen **without lifting a hammer**!

Those same skills that were passed on to Janet were passed on to Vanessa as her grandfather took her under his wing and taught her how to use construction tools.

Now, Vanessa, an emergency inspector for SUEZ, and Janet, an assistant inspector,



are the women you want to call when you need help with your water utility service in Bergen and Hudson County!

Why do you build with Habitat Bergen?

Vanessa: The best feeling is seeing the women I've trained at SUEZ succeed in the field. I trained my mother and another co-worker. That person is the first female to work on a valve truck, and my mother is the second female to be an assistant in the field.
