Can you imagine a world where everyone has a decent place to live? Habitat can, which is why since 1976 Habitat for Humanity International has helped 6.8 million people find strength, stability and self-reliance through safe, decent and affordable shelter. Habitat Bergen was founded in 1994, and while we have made great strides in providing affordable housing to low-income families and restored 80 homes severely affected by SuperStorm Sandy, there is still more work to be done. With a population of approximately 938,000 people, Bergen County has six of the most affluent towns in the state which makes it hard to believe that 3.5% of the population is homeless.

Habitat Bergen strives to be part of the housing solution. We believe that a decent place to live and an affordable mortgage creates a situation where homeowners can save more, invest in education, pursue opportunity and have more financial stability. A Habitat home is an equalizing force for a family. Better, affordable living conditions lead to improved health, stronger childhood development and the opportunity to make forward-looking choices.
